

Sportika Update: COVID-19 (Coronavirus)

Sportika Families,

We have been monitoring the COVID-19 (Coronavirus) situation so that we can assess risks and proactively respond to developments. Of course, our number one focus is on the health, safety, and wellbeing of our staff members, customers, and their families.

Keeping that in mind, please note that we are taking several important and precautionary steps with our staff and guests. We have decided to close for maintenance and renovations during this time. As an important partner in the execution of our health and safety plan we would like to ask you to read carefully these precautionary measures and best practices instructed by the CDC.

- We have asked our staff to please be extra diligent about washing their hands and exercising the proper coughing & sneezing etiquette.
- For any staff or guest that may have been exposed to the virus, or has pre-existing medical conditions which put them at high risk, we have asked that they seek medical attention where needed and to not come to work
- For any staff or guest that has sick family members at home, we have asked they refer to CDC guidance for [how to conduct a risk assessment](#) of their potential exposure.
- We are asking any tournament or event host to follow all precautionary measures put out by the CDC to their guests and participants.
- We have increased locations in the building where Hand Sanitizer are available to our guests and encourage everyone to use as recommended by the CDC.
- We would ask that all players refrain from shaking hands and close personal contact for the time being while at our facility.
- We will be cleaning and disinfecting frequently touched objects and surfaces using a cleaning spray or wipe
- We are asking our staff and guests to avoid touching their eyes, nose, and mouth while in the facility as advised by the CDC.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after going to the bathroom; before eating; and after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing.
